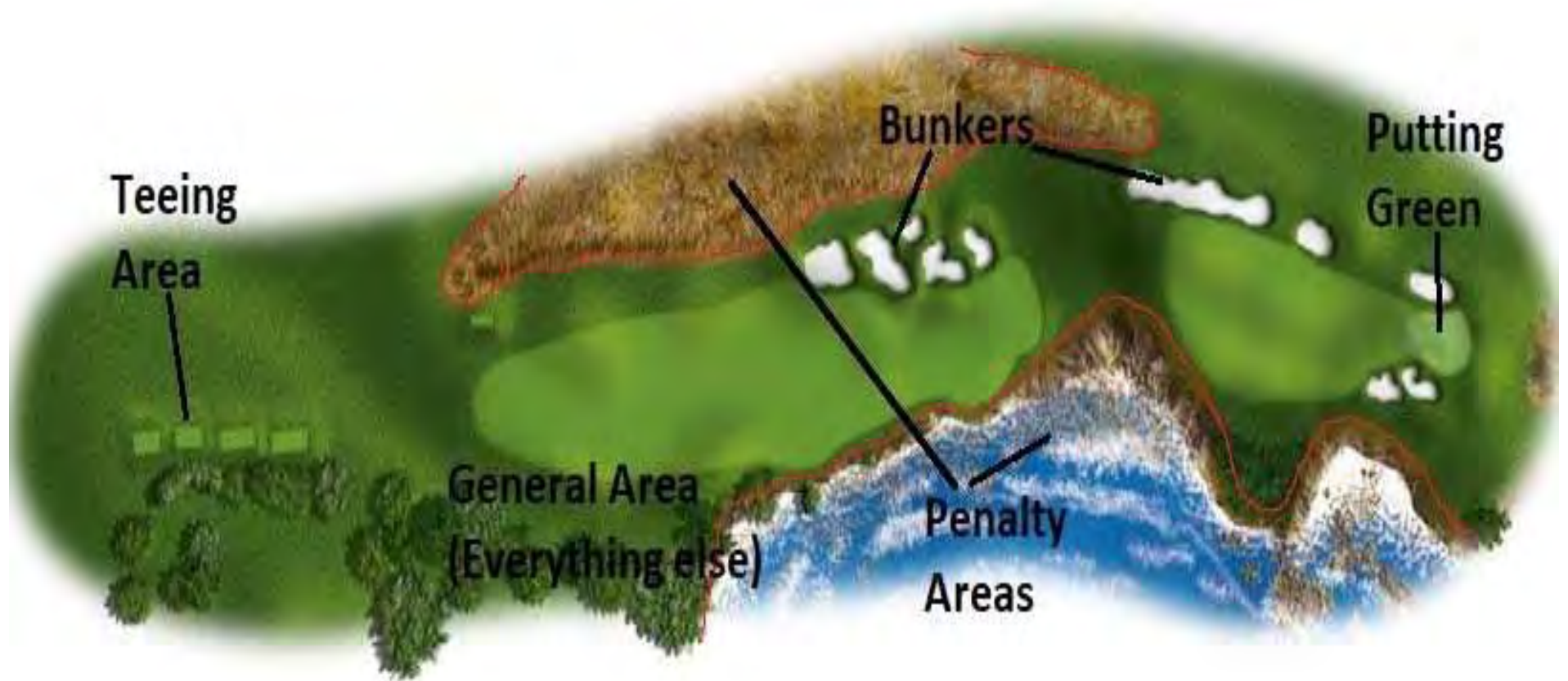


## Areas of the Course



## Stroke & Distance Local Rule E-5

- Provides an extra relief option for a ball that is Out of Bounds or Lost outside a penalty area.
- When a **player's** ball has not been found, or it is known or virtually certain that his/her ball is out of bounds the player may take stroke and distance relief, or when the Model Local Rule E-5 is introduced, the player has the additional option to drop a ball in and play from a prescribed relief area for **two penalty strokes**
- To be encouraged for members and visitors for *casual play only*.
- Not appropriate for higher level competitions.

# Stroke and Distance Local Rule E-5

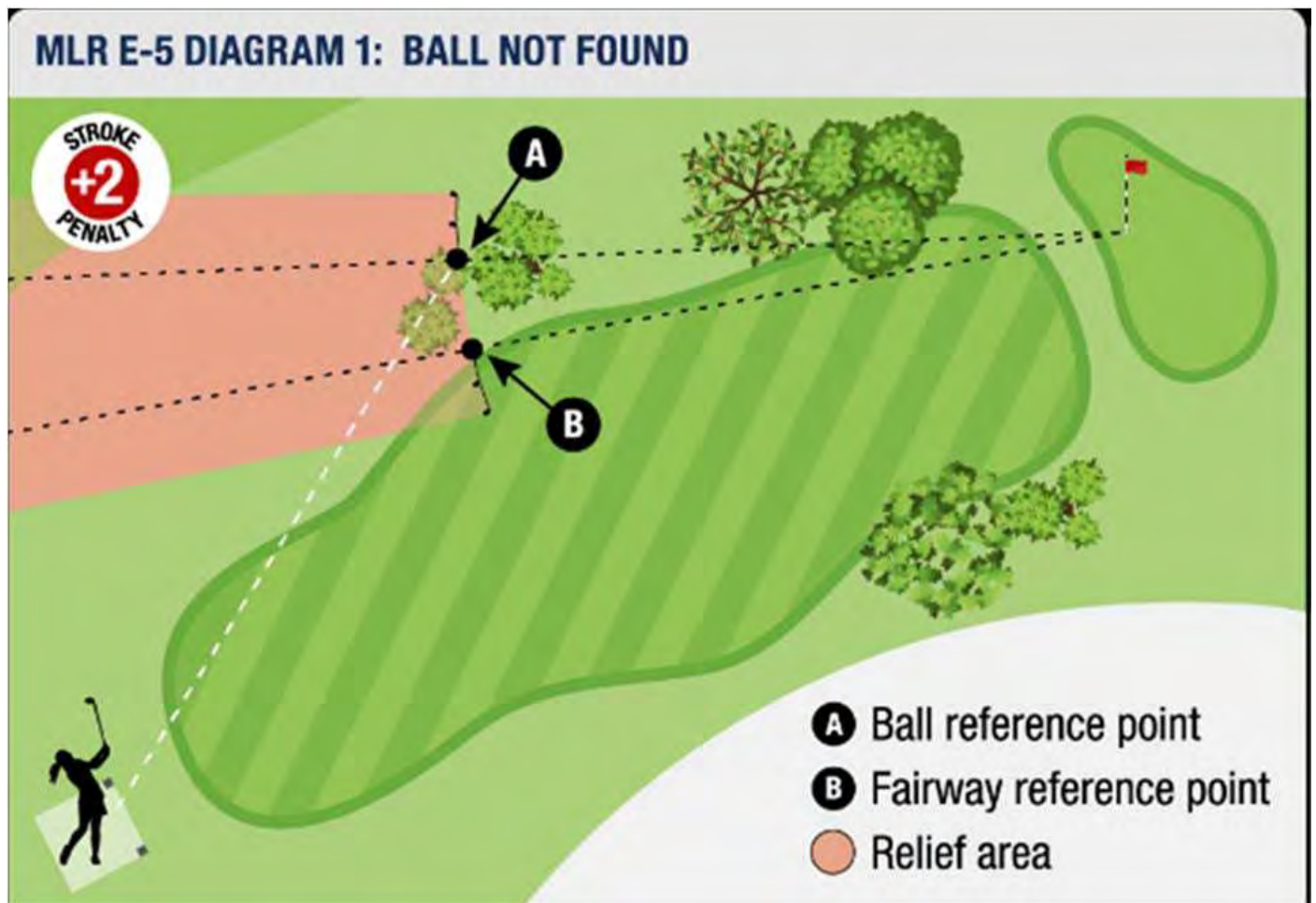
## Ball Not Found

**A** – Ball reference point. The point where the original ball is estimated to have come to rest on the course

**B** – Fairway Reference Point. The point of fairway of the hole being played that is nearest to the ball reference point. But is not nearer the hole than the ball reference point.

Size of Relief Area – Anywhere between: A line from the hole through the ball reference point (A) (and within two club lengths to the outside of that line), and A line from the hole through the fairway reference point (B) (and within two club lengths to the fairway side of that line)

Limits on Relief Area – Must not be nearer the hole than the ball reference point, and must be in the General Area



# Stroke and Distance Local Rule E-5

## Ball Out of Bounds

**A** – Ball reference point. The point where the original ball is estimated to have last crossed the edge of the course boundary to go out of bounds.

**B** – Fairway Reference Point: The point of fairway of the hole being played (B) that is nearest to the ball reference point, but is not nearer the hole than the ball reference point.

Size of Relief Area: A line from the hole through the ball reference point

(A) and within two club lengths to the outside of the line but still on the course and a line from the hole through the fairway reference point (B) and within two club lengths to the fairway side of that line.

Limits on Relief Area: Must not be nearer the hole than the ball reference point and must be in the general area.
